Hana is learning about solids, liquids and gases in science class at school. Hana's teacher tells the class they have homework. They need to find solids, liquids and gases.




Hana goes home. Hana looks for solids. Hana knows a solid is something that has a shape. Hana looks around her house.

These are all solids.




Hana looks for liquids. Hana knows a liquid is something that does not have its own shape. It can flow. Hana looks around her house.



Hana sees water in the fish bowl and milk in a glass. These are liquids.




Hana looks for gases. Hana knows that a gas has no shape. She knows that air is a gas. Can we see a gas? Hana looks around her house.



Hana sees her mom cooking noodles.


There is steam above the pot. Hana
